

What is the 62 inch rule on Delta?

Understanding the 62-Inch Rule on Delta Airlines

The 62-inch rule refers to the maximum linear dimension allowed for standard checked bags on Delta Airlines. This measurement is calculated using the following formula:

✓ **Length + Width + Height ≤ 62 inches (157 cm)**

This means that Delta Airlines does not look at each measurement separately. Instead the airline adds all three dimensions together. If the total is 62 inches or less the bag qualifies as a standard checked bag.

Example of a Bag That Meets the 62-Inch Rule

Length: 28 inches

Width: 17 inches

Height: 10 inches

Total: 28 + 17 + 10 = 55 inches

This bag is allowed without oversize fees .

What Happens If Your Bag Exceeds 62 Inches?

If the combined dimensions of your bag exceed 62 inches Delta Airlines considers it an oversized bag. Oversized bags come with additional fees which vary depending on the route.

- Typical oversize fees range from **\$200 to \$300 per bag**.
- Oversized bags may also have weight limits so even if the bag is within weight but larger than 62 inches fees still apply.

Delta Airlines use size restrictions to ensure that luggage fits safely in aircraft cargo holds and remains easy to handle for staff. The 62-inch rule is a standard measurement used by most major U.S. Delta Airlines not just Delta Airlines.

Tips to Stay Within the 62-Inch Limit

3. Avoid Overpacking

Stuffing your bag can make it bulge and exceed the size limit.

4. Use Two Bags Instead of One

It may be cheaper to check two regular bags than one oversized one.

Does the 62-Inch Rule Apply to All Fare Types?

Yes the rule applies to all Delta Airlines fares including:

- Basic Economy
- Main Cabin
- Comfort+
- First Class
- Delta Airlines Premium Select
- Delta Airlines One

Premium cabins allow heavier bags but size limits remain the same.
